Taxes due Monday, WebFile is a free, easy way to file with Kansas

April 12, 2011

TOPEKA – With Monday's tax deadline fast approaching, last minute filers still have a quick and free option for filing their Kansas income taxes or Homestead Refund Claim through Kansas WebFile.

The free program, which can be found at www.kansas.gov/webfile, walks people through the process step-by-step and allows them to have their returns deposited electronically. An electronic deposit gets the money back in peoples' wallets up to 80 percent faster that requesting a paper check.

"This free and easy online program is a great option for Kansans to securely and quickly file their income taxes with the state," said Revenue Secretary Nick Jordan. "By choosing to receive their return by electronic deposit, people can also get their money back in their pockets much faster than in prior years."

To register for an account with WebFile, you will need:

- A working email account
- Their Social Security number
- For your increased security, you must have either 1.) your refund/balance due amount from your prior year's taxes or 2.) a PIN
- A PIN is available by calling 785-296-6993

Due to seasonally high call volumes, filers are encouraged to use their refund/balance due amount from the prior year's taxes to expedite their experience.

Those having trouble with the program or logging on may call the 785-296-6993 from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.

People can also e-file through their chosen tax professional.

Taxes are due April 18.
