**Fire Standard Compliant (FSC) Cigarettes**

As of July 1, 2010, it is unlawful to sell cigarettes that are not fire standard compliant. The cigarette packages and cartons have FSC near the barcode or on the bottom of the packs. Any Non-FSC cigarettes remaining in an establishment will be seized by Cigarette And Tobacco Enforcement (CATE) inspectors. Administrative action may be taken against your cigarette retail dealer license for such violations.

**Brands Allowed for Sale in Kansas**

The Kansas Attorney General's office is charged with maintaining a directory of brands permitted to be sold in Kansas. The directories include cigarettes that are in compliance with the Master Settlement Agreement (MSA) and are Fire Standard Compliant (FSC). The cigarettes must be in compliance with both to be permitted for sale in Kansas. Any non-compliant cigarettes located will be deemed contraband and seized. **Indoor Clean Air Act**

As of July 1, 2010, smoking is prohibited in most of the following indoor locations in Kansas: public places, places of employment, restaurants and bars. Smoking is also prohibited within 10 feet of any doorway, open window or air intake where smoking is prohibited. Businesses are also required to post signs stating that smoking is prohibited by state law. These signs are available for free by download at [www.kssmokefree.org](http://www.kssmokefree.org).

Tobacco shops that derive not less than 65% of gross receipts from the sale of tobacco are exempt from the Indoor Clean Air Act.

If there is a local clean indoor air law and the provisions are more restrictive, the local provisions will apply. The provisions of the state law that are more restrictive will supersede the local provisions.

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### **Self Service Displays**

Effective July 1, 2010, it is unlawful to sell cigarettes or tobacco products by a self-service display except in a vending machine or in a tobacco specialty store. This includes all cigarettes and other tobacco products (little cigars, chew, blunts, etc.).

Tobacco specialty stores that derive not less than 75% of gross receipts from the sale of tobacco may have self service displays.

### **FDA Regulations and Training**

As of July 22, 2010, manufacturers can no longer distribute for sale any tobacco products labeled or advertised as "light," "low," or "mild" or similar descriptors. However, retailers are allowed to sell any existing product they have.

### **FDA Enforcement Contract**

The CATE team will be expanding due to Kansas receiving a grant from the FDA to enforce FDA regulations. The CATE Inspectors will be conducting inspections and controlled buys under the FDA grant in addition to the inspections and controlled buys for the state. Retailers may receive citations from the FDA in the mail if a violation is found. Kansas Retail Dealer licenses may be affected if a citation from the FDA is not satisfied.
