

KANSAS LIQUOR LICENSE AND PERMIT TYPES

Type	LICENSE DESCRIPTION	DEFINITION
Off-premise	Farm Winery License	Allows the licensee to manufacture and store domestic table wine and domestic fortified wine in a quantity not exceeding 100,000 gallons per year. The sale of wine manufactured by the licensee in the original unopened container.
Off-premise	Farm Winery Outlet License	Allows the licensee to sell domestic wine and domestic fortified wine in the original unopened container to consumers for consumption off the licensed premises.
Off-Premise	Bona Fide Farmers' Market Sales Permit	Allows a farm winery licensee, a member of the licensee's family or an employee of the licensee to sell wine in the original unopened container produced and bottled by the licensee at a bona fide farmers' market located at a site approved by the Director. <b>Permit is not available until 7/1/09</b>
Off-premise	Microbrewery License	Allows the manufacturer and storage of not less than 100 nor more than 15,000 barrels of domestic beer during the license year. The sale of beer manufactured by the licensee in the original unopened container to be consumed off the licensed premise.
Off-premise	Retailer's License	Allows the licensee to sell and offer for sale at retail and delivery in the original package alcoholic liquor for use or consumption off of an away from the premises and other sales as authorized by K.S.A. 41-308.
On-Premise	Caterer License	Allows the licensee to offer for sale, sell and serve alcoholic liquor for consumption on unlicensed premises, which may be open to the public.
On-Premise	Class A Club License (bona fide nonprofit social, fraternal or war veterans)	Allows the licensee to offer for sale, sell and serve alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises by members and their families and guests accompanying them.
On-Premise	Class B Club License (private)	Allows the licensee to offer for sale, sell and serve alcoholic liquor for consumption on the licensed premises by members and guests accompanying them.
On-Premise	Drinking Establishment License	Allows the licensee to offer for sale, sell and serve alcoholic liquor for consumption on licensed premises, which may be open to the public.
On-Premise	Drinking Establishment/Caterer License	Allows the licensee all the rights and privileges of a holder of a drinking establishment license and of a licensed caterer.
On-Premise	Hotel/Drinking Establishment License	Any hotel in which the entire premises are licensed as a drinking establishment or as a drinking establishment/caterer may sell alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage by means of minibars located in guest rooms of such hotels.
On-Premise	Temporary Permit	Allows the permit holder to offer for sale, sell and serve alcoholic liquor for consumption on unlicensed premises which may be open to the public.
	Distributor License; Beer	Allows the licensee to make the wholesale purchase, importation and storage of beer, cereal malt beverage and flavored malt beverage and the sale to licensees as authorized by K.S.A. 41-307.
	Distributor License; Spirits	Allows the licensee to make the wholesale purchase, importation and storage of spirits; but, all spirits purchased and imported which is manufactured in the United States shall be purchased from the primary American source of supply or from another licensed spirits distributor. and the sale to licensees as authorized by K.S.A. 41-306.

Type	LICENSE DESCRIPTION	DEFINITION
	Distributor License; Wine	Allows the licensee to make the wholesale purchase, importation and storage of wine; but, all wine purchased and imported which is manufactured in the United States shall be purchased from the primary American source of supply or from another licensed wine distributor and the sale to licensees as authorized by K.S.A. 41-306a.
	Manufacturer's License	Allows the licensee to manufacture and storage alcoholic liquor and cereal malt beverage and the sale to licensees as authorized by K.S.A. 41-305.
	Microbrewery Packaging and Warehousing Facility License	Allows existing microbrewery licensees to move products from their brewery to a separate facility for packaging and/or storage. Products sold to licensed beer wholesalers may be delivered directly from this facility to the wholesalers. For all other sales, products must first be transferred back to the microbrewery premises.
	Non-Beverage User License	Allows the licensee to purchase alcohol or wine from a licensed manufacturer or distributor to be used solely for non-beverage purposes.
	Non-Beverage User Permit	Allows any school, college, hospital, sanatorium or other institution caring for the sick to import alcohol or wine or purchase alcohol or wine from a microbrewery, farm winery, manufacturer or distributor for scientific, chemical, experimental, mechanical or medicinal purposes.
	Special Order Shipping License	Allows the winery to ship to ship wine upon order directly to consumers for personal or household use in Kansas. <b>Permit is not available until 7/1/09</b>
	Supplier Permit	Allows a manufacturer of alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage or an agent of such manufacturer, other than a salesperson, to sell alcoholic liquor or cereal malt beverage to Kansas distributors.
	Winery Shipping Permit; Large Wineries	Allows a person holding a valid license authorizing the manufacture of wine in another state and which manufacturers wine in a quantity of 100,000 gallons or more per year may sell wine to a consumer in Kansas. <b>Will be repealed effective 7/1/09</b>
	Winery Shipping Permit; Small Wineries	Allows a person holding a valid Kansas farm winery license or a person which holds a valid license authorizing the manufacture of wine in another state and which manufacturers wine in a quantity not exceeding 100,000 gallons or more per year may sell wine to a consumer in Kansas. <b>Will be repealed effective 7/1/09</b>
